

## WHAT IS THE BURSARY?

At APCCA we are committed to helping address inequality and widening access to our courses in order to increase diversity and cultural representation amongst our students, practitioners and tutors and to support students from vulnerable groups, or who are in difficult financial circumstances

Defined vulnerable groups include care leavers, applicants with disabilities, or those who are who on low income or are receiving Income Support, or Universal Credit.

An ethnically diverse and culturally reflective workforce is important to help address mental and emotional health needs amongst service users.

We recognise that issues caused by racism and inequality create barriers to training and to continuing professional development for already qualified mental health professionals from Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic (BAME) backgrounds. Read more here.

The bursary covers two thirds of the fees for our courses.

We are offering a bursary that covers the full fee on our courses to Ukrainian applicants who have been impacted by the war.

We offer opportunities for students who demonstrate exceptional skills who would like to work towards becoming a tutor via our supportive mentoring programme.

Students who wish to apply will need to met the following criteria:

- Apply and be offered a place on the course.
- Demonstrate a genuine need for financial support.
- Demonstrate a commitment to developing practice.
- Demonstrate a commitment to supporting the work of APCCA for two years after course completion.
